While on vacation with my family, we found ourselves in an outdoor shopping area, in 90 degree heat, and I had 4 little girls who were ready for a cold drink. So I located a vending machine that was glowing with the promise of cold, refreshing, overpriced bottles of water. I approached the machine, swiped my debit card, pressed the button, expecting the bottle to drop out and satisfy our thirsty throats, but sadly it didn't happen. The LED display flashed, "sold out". In that moment, my kids and I became even more irritated and impatient as our mouths dried with every passing second. "What?! I thought this was going to work? This wasn't supposed to happen! What are we going to do now?!"

Now all hope wasn't lost. We did eventually find another fully stocked vending machine, but this little experience affirmed what I believe God has been trying to teach me lately – I'm addicted to results. I want life to work like a little vending machine: I do "this" and then "that" happens. If I don't immediately see a result from my effort in my work, relationships, family, or even my faith, then something must be wrong.

The problem is that life isn't like a vending machine. Often times we don't see or receive immediate results, but instead, we need to wait. "Wait" is likely a bad "4 letter word" for most of us. No one likes to wait, but as followers of Jesus and people of God, we need to learn to. David, a man who knew the power of waiting, wrote in Psalm 27.14 "Wait for the Lord; be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord". The prophet Isaiah shares a similar insight in Isaiah 40.31, "but they who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint."

Waiting reminds us that we are not the Lord. Waiting reminds us that life, and more importantly, God is not a vending machine. In fact, if we can learn to wait, we'll often find that God can do more in our waiting than we can do in our impatient doing. For those like me, who find themselves struggling with being "addicted" to results, I encourage you to listen to Bethany Dillon's song "To Those Who Wait". It has consistently been a reminder to me of the power of waiting.

Our summer in Kids' Ministry was full of excitement at our Zooplosion, learning Bible lessons from animals. Nancy Kroll came to visit and talked to us about how she rescues and cares for God's creatures. She also taught us about what we should do when we find abandoned baby animals and injured animals. Jason Herring brought in some feathered friends chickens - and talked to us about their needs and caring for them. Nobody got pecked! It was interesting to see and hear about the different kinds of chickens. We also had the Zoomobile from Seneca zoo come and visit. They brought different animals and it was great to hear about some animals you don't see everyday.

This Fall will bring a new look to our downstairs and a new name. Kids Town! Besides a new look, our programming structure will change. In the past years, our two kids' services were different in content and format. We will now have our school age groups learning the same Bible story for the day at both services. The structure of the two services will now be similar as we plan to incorporate the best features of each into one great program. This should be helpful to families as they discuss with their 'children what they learned at church that day. A more detailed explanation will be sent to parents before we begin classes.

Our midweek programming will also see some changes as we will divide the 4th-6th graders into boys and girls clubs. The boys will be doing different building projects using Legos, Playmobil, trains, and other building materials. The girls will have opportunities to use their creativity in art, music and

other areas of interest. Our K-3rd grade will be doing a series called "Paws and Tales" which will feature stories, video, games and projects.

Our booth at the Corn Festival drew many families into the tents. We used a Zoo theme this year and expanded our space from one tent to two tents. This provided more room for us to interact with people as they came into our section. We had some great conversations with individuals about our church. We handed out over 100 booklets which presented the story of Noah with a Gospel presentation at the end of the book. We continue to pray for the seeds that were planted at this great outreach event.

Our picnics were well attended this year. It was very encouraging to see these fellowship opportunities grow. The weather was great, the food was fantastic and everyone enjoyed the services. Our 4 corners facility is such a great blessing to use for these events.

I'm looking forward to our great Fall season and the many plans we have. Thank you for your continued prayers and help in our Children's ministry. With vacations, camps, and family time, the summer seemed to be a little hectic for many. The AWC Youth -Ministry ended with a GREAT summer retreat of our own. The camp focused on what it means to be "Fishers of O People." With insightful conversations, we discussed WHY we are to fish for people (because of what God has C done for us). We also established WHAT we fish with (which is the Good News of Jesus). Not only did we define what the Gospel of Jesus is, but we also presented an overview of God's Story of Redemption that is found in the Bible. After learning the aspects of WHY we fish and WHAT we fish with, our campfire conversations focused on practical ways on HOW we fish (recognizing how we can influence the people already around us with the Gospel). For those of you who know our family, you know that we enjoy being active in ministry. We pray and we plan, as if we will have 100% energy, passion & efficiency to complete the plans that we feel God is laying before us. Then, we seek the Spirit's guidance and provision, with prayerful & hopeful expectations to see how the Lord will help us accomplish (OR how the Lord will change) the tasks laid out before us. With amazement, the past four years God has given us the mental and physical ability, without fail. But 2019 has been a different year. Not only have we been limited physically and by resources (missionaries leaving the field early, pastors who are out of commission because of tuberculosis, computer viruses that erase months of hard work, electricity and internet outages daily), but our passion and energy levels have been really low as well.

We must confess, that for most of March through the end of May, we have felt like complete failures, unable to physically complete the tasks we committed to doing the beginning of 2019 (due to this time of low energy, low passion and low resources).



In ministry we have found that there is a HUGE temptation to count our worth according to the tasks ticked off our lists, or how well we are measuring up to the expectations made by man (yes, all good tools that do help us stay accountable), but what a timely & encouraging reminder that our worth comes 1st from being HIS son and then we are only responsible to walk in obedience down the path He has marked for each of us.

Before Jesus ever started His ministry we heard the Father's voice say "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased and delighted!" (MATTHEW 3:17 AMP)









Growing Up Social by Gary Chapman & Arlene Pellicane Marriage & Family
